

Consignor Tips

- While using a tagging gun is not required, the process is much faster and easier on your fingers. You can purchase a tagging gun at Walmart, Hobby Lobby, Amazon and many other stores. We also sell them for \$10 at the church desk.
- Be sure, when you are tagging, to ONLY tag where it will not damage the item/material. Seams, and store tags are great places to attach seller tags.
- The cleaner and fresher your item looks on your hanger, the faster and higher it will sell! Iron wrinkles, flatten collars, straighten bows, etc. The more money you make, the more we can give!
- The primary concern is to make sure those tags stay on your items, BUT try to avoid putting tape over the barcodes. Our scanners don't like it! Check out goes much smoother when tags are easily seen and scanned.
- Safety pin those clothes to hangers. With the constant shuffle of the racks, items not secured to hangers slip off and are no longer in sight to buyers!
- Buyers want to see and feel those soft blankets and hats. These items don't always need a bag. If you choose not to use a bag, make sure ALL pieces are secured together with the tag easily visible.
- ALL ITEMS ON HANGERS MUST BE HUNG WITH THE HANGER FACING THE LEFT. IF YOU LOOK AT YOUR HANGER IT SHOULD BE FACING THE SAME WAY AS A QUESTION MARK. SHOPPERS WILL SHOP BY MOVING CLOTHES RIGHT TO LEFT FACING THE FRONT OF THE GARMENT ON THE RACK.
- If you have more than one seller number, be sure all items in each number are organized together. DO NOT COMBINE ITEMS WITH DIFFERENT SELLER NUMBERS. Check-in needs to go smoothly and efficiently, so make sure items are in order and separated properly BEFORE you bring them.
